

Himanshu Agarwal is working as Executive Editor of Asian Journal of Chemistry, since March 2006. He received the Chemistry degree from Delhi University, Delhi in 1996 followed by post-Graduation in 1998 and obtained the Ph.D. in February 2003 (JRF & SRF) from Department of Applied Chemistry, Faculty of Technology, Delhi University, Delhi, India. Before the current position, he worked as Research Associate from Zakir Husain College (Delhi University), Delhi (till 2006).

His specialization and current researches are related to Ion Selective Electrodes, Chemical Sensors and Wastewater treatment by developing low cost adsorbents, co-author of more than 35 research publications.
